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## Section One

### 1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Alamo Area High School Swimming League (AAHSSL) is an affiliation of more than fifty high school swimming teams in what may generally be characterized as the Greater San Antonio Metropolitan area. It encompasses virtually all of the teams in Bexar County as well as several in nearby counties.
- 1.2 The AAHSSL (the League) is organized, managed and operated under the auspices of the Alamo Area Aquatic Association (AAAA). AAAA, which is an umbrella organization of educational organizations affiliated with USA Swimming (USA-S). It is comprised of competitive swimming teams from the Converse-Judson, North East, Northside, and San Antonio Independent School Districts (ISDs) plus the Jewish Community Center and Palo Alto College. It is incorporated as a non-profit organization under Texas Law and the Internal Revenue Service. The organization is governed by a recognized Board of Directors (BoD) and functions within a set of formal By-Laws for the betterment of competitive swimming within the Greater San Antonio Metropolitan Area.

## Section Two

### 2. League Membership Requirements

- 2.1. High schools with swim teams who wish to participate in the AAHSSL, must meet the following requirements:
  - 2.1.1 Schools must be a member of a League or Association which has a season ending, culminating, or championship meet, such as the University Interscholastic League's (UIL) District, Regional and State Meets, or the Texas Association of Private and Parochial School's (TAPPS) Championship Meet.
  - 2.1.2 Non-members of UIL and TAPPS must, each year, provide a certificate of liability insurance with a minimum limit of \$300,000 per occurrence for bodily injury coverage and \$100,000 per occurrence for property damage insurance (\$300,000 for any non-state funded ISD) i.e. private, charter, and parochial schools, which lists host facilities and districts as being additionally insured, Alamo Community College District also requires a Waiver of Subrogation (WOS)
  - 2.1.3 Member teams are required to pay an AAHSSL entry fee of \$100.00. Teams who may later elect to leave the League, and subsequently choose to return, will be required to pay the \$100.00 membership fee again.
  - 2.1.4 Member teams are required to pay a yearly membership fee of \$30.00 no later than September First each year. After September First, the membership fee rises to \$60.00. The final deadline to register is November First of each year.

## Section Three

### 3. Facility Standards

- 3.1 In order to host AAHSSL Meets wherein times achieved may be utilized for advancement to higher caliber competitions, facilities must meet the following minimum standards:
  - 3.1.1 Availability of at least six (6) competitive lanes, of which meet the minimum depth standards prescribed by the National Federation of High School Swimming.
  - 3.1.2 Availability of at least two (2) 25-yard warm-up / cool down lanes.
  - 3.1.3 A fully functioning, automatic timing system including non-slip touch pads, console, backup buttons, an electronic scoreboard and the peripherals necessary to support the equipment.
  - 3.1.4 Availability of at least one hand timer per lane, plus the necessary digital stopwatches for use.
  - 3.1.5 Well-trained, competent and experienced timing and computer system operators.

- 3.1.6 Active Software’s HY-TEK Meet Manager for Windows versions 5.0 or 6.0 operated by competent and experienced personnel and running on appropriate computers.
- 3.1.7 A properly maintained and fully operational, competitive aquatic facility; meeting all current local and state health and safety requirements as well as the Federation Facility Standards.

## Section Four

### 4. General Policies and Procedures

- 4.1. Overall direction of High School swimming in the Converse-Judson (**JU**), North East (**NE**), Northside (**BL** and **NS**), San Antonio (**SA**) Independent School Districts and Palo Alto College (**PA**) will be provided by the respective Athletic Directors, District or Institutional Aquatic Directors, Coordinators, or Head Coaches.
  - 4.1.1 At **AH, NE, NS, PA,** and **SA** the Aquatic Coordinators / Directors will manage the competitive program in their respective facilities.
  - 4.1.2 Input from teams outside these entities, who participate in the AAHSSL and may be scheduled to compete at any one of the seven (7) venues, shall be considered.
- 4.2 During each high school season there are dual, double dual, triangular, quadrangular, numbered invitationals, named invitational(s), or other meets scheduled prior to the annual UIL District Championships. These shall be held at some, or all of the ten (10) competitive venues in the Metro Area, generally on common weekends.
- 4.4 Within this document, Dual, Double Dual, Triangular, Quadrangular, Pentathlon and Numbered Invitational Meets are generally referred to as **Dual Plus** Meets.
- 4.5 Identification of Competitive Venues as per Section 3.:

\*Codes are used ONLY for file and venue identification purposes on the AAAA Web Site and within this document.

- 4.6 Meets are normally held on coinciding days of the week, Thursday through Saturday, exact time dependent on the venue.
- 4.7 Efforts are made to orchestrate the schedule in order to maximize the opportunities for media coverage, optimization of the level of competition and to facilitate the availability of officials.
- 4.8 A consolidated meet schedule is posted on the AAAA website (www.aaaa-sa.org), and is accessible from the Dual Plus Calendar and Results Page prior to the start of school in the fall.
- 4.9 At **AH, BL, NE, and NS** each team is allowed four (4) entries per individual event and (4) entries per relay event in all standard Federation dual, triangular, quadrangular, double-duals.
- 4.10 A minimum of six (6) lanes will be used for all League meets of this type.
- 4.11 At **SA** each team is allowed four (4) entries per individual event and (2) entries per relay event in all Invitational Meets.
  - 4.11.1 Swimmers are seeded by time and gender, with heats swum fastest to slowest.
- 4.12 At **PA** each team is allowed four (4) entries per individual event and two (2) entries per relay event in all Invitational Meets.
  - 4.12.1 Swimmers are combined, seeded by time and gender, and swum fastest to slowest in timed final events.



4.13 There are other venues which *may* conduct High School Competitions but, currently do not meet the facility requirements set forth in Section Three.

4.13.1 Therefore, times achieved in these venues cannot be used for any advancement or ranking purposes. They are noted just below:

4.13.2 If, however, the appropriate SwmmBkup File (Section Thirteen.) Is provided to the Webmaster, Final Results, Scores and the Commlink File will be posted with appropriate notations regarding the limitations noted just above.

4.14 Seeding

4.14.1 Seeding for all Dual Plus and Named Invitational Meets will be ***fastest to slowest***.

4.14.2 Seeding of Championship Meets will be by Rule.

## Section Five

### 5. Diving

5.1 Diving competition is normally conducted *independently* of the League Dual Plus Meets, but are conducted in conjunction with Named Invitationals and Championship meets

5.1.1 A minimum of three (3) and a maximum of five (5) judges are required for all six (6) dive competitions.

5.1.2 A minimum of five (5) and a maximum of seven (7) judges for all eleven (11) dive Invitational and Championship competitions, e.g., South Zone TISCA, UIL Districts and Regionals.

5.1.3 All judges for League competitions must be currently registered with Arbiter Sports by December First of each calendar year.

5.1.4 Entries into six (6) dive competitions become official when the diving sheets are submitted.

5.1.5 Diving sheets must be prepared and submitted in accordance with UIL and National Federation Rules following the proper format.

5.1.5.1 Diving meet entries are due by noon on Tuesday prior to the meet.

5.1.5.2 Entries for competition at **NE, NS, and PA** following sites must be completed via ***cleanentries.com***

5.1.5.3 Entries for competition at SA must be emailed to the meet administrator noted on the League Diving Schedule

5.1.6 Entries into eleven (11) dive competitions, with the exception of the State Preview Invitational, will be considered official by including divers in HY-TEK Team Manager Entry File **and** diving sheet submission. Diving sheets must be in accordance with UIL and National Federation Rules following the proper format. All diving meet sheet submissions are due by noon on Tuesday prior to the meet.

5.1.6.1 Entries for competition at **NE, NS, and PA** must be completed via ***cleanentries.com***

5.1.6.2 Entries for competition at SA must be emailed to the meet administrator noted on the League Diving Schedule.

5.2. Web Posting of Diving Results

5.2.1 Results from Dual Plus and Named Invitational Diving competition are posted on the AAAA Web Site under their own Calendar and Schedule

5.2.2 Results from Championship Diving competition are posted coincident with the Final Meet Results



## Section Six

### 6. Entry into League Meets

- 6.1** Well before each High School Season begins, the AAAA BoD develops Swimming and Diving Meet Schedules and Calendars, which are made available to all League Member Team coaches.
- 6.1.1** In consideration of those Schedules / Calendars, and with minimal restrictions, coaches may then choose the dates, meets and venues in which they wish to participate.
- 6.1.2** Once the choices have been made and recorded, before school starts, they will be posted on the AAAA Web Site.
- 6.2.** Entries into all League meets will be in accordance with (IAW) UIL and National Federation Rules; i.e. a competitor shall be permitted to enter a maximum of four (4) events, no more than two (2) of which may be individual events (Rule 3, Section 2, Article 1).
- 6.2.1** In some few instances, e.g., Pentathlons, this may not apply – the Meet Information will specify.
- 6.3** **In most, but not all, League meets; an individual competitor or relay team is *not* considered to be officially entered into an event until actually stepping up on the block or into the water, as the case may be**, i.e., there is no penalty for scratching or being a NO SHOW.
- 6.3.1** This policy applies to all League Dual Plus and Named Invitational Meets.
- 6.3.2** This policy DOES NOT apply to the South Zone TISCA, UIL District or Regional Championships and will be noted in the applicable Meet Information.
- 6.4** Since lanes are or may be assigned in advance, thus allowing the publication of heat sheets, Meet Hosts require that schools provide entries no later than 12-noon of the Tuesday prior to the scheduled start time of any League meet taking place on Friday or Saturday.
- 6.5** Entries for Thursday night meets are due no later than 12-noon of the Monday prior to the meet.
- 6.6** Entries to all League Meets, including South Zone TISCA, may be made in person or via email, but must include these three (3) Team / Meet Manager Files:
- 6.6.1** HY-TEK Team Manager Entry file – clearly labeled with team 3- or 4-letter code
- 6.6.2** Meet Entry Report in PDF format – generated by Team Manager
- 6.6.3** Meet Entry Fee Report in PDF format – generated by Team Manager
- 6.7** Coaches must complete arrangements with meet host for payment of entry fees in the body of submission email, or when submitting in person, at the time of delivery of entries.
- 6.8** Individual meet entry fees for all Dual Plus and Nameed Invitational Meets are \$10.00 per swimmer, unless the applicable Meet Information states otherwise, and shall not, in any case; exceed \$200.00 per gender per team.
- 6.9** Teams who were members of the League as of September 1, 2013 or before are grandfathered under previous rules and exempt from this requirement.
- 6.10** Teams from outside Bexar County, that do not have the grandfather privilege, and who wish to participate in AAHSSL Meets must submit entry fees in the amount of \$10.00 per athlete with no cap.

## Section Eight

### 8. Sub-Varsity Swims

- 8.1** Exhibition Swims are not permitted in Texas High School Competition.
- 8.1.1** Such competition must be designated as “Sub-Varsity,” and are to be specifically noted as such in the Meet Results.
- 8.1.2** The most expedient method of accomplishing this is to create four additional events as noted below, ensuring any Sub-Varsity athletes are properly entered into them and adding appropriate comments in Meet Manager, as necessary, to ensure proper annotation in the posted Results.

- 8.1.3** The “Event Comments” from the Events Menu, must be annotated on line number two to read:
- 8.1.3.1** Sub-Varsity event / Not scored!
- 8.1.3.1.1** Please refer to the Meet Manager “Screen Shots” on pages 11 and 12.
- 8.2** Sub-Varsity Swims are permitted at all Dual Plus and Named Invitational Meets, but are restricted to the 50- and 100-yard freestyle events; and then only to the extent of creating but a single additional heat.
- 8.2.1** Each team may enter four (4) Sub-Varsity swimmers in the 50- and 100-yard freestyle events.
- 8.2.2** The scoring events will always be swum first when any Sub-Varsity competition is conducted.
- 8.2.3** Sub-Varsity Swimmers must be clearly indicated with the team’s entry.
- 8.2.4** Sub-Varsity swims *shall* count as one of the four (4) allowed entries, they may not score, times achieved may be utilized as qualifying times and swimmers are subject to disqualification.

### 9. Scoring of Meets (Rule 7, Article 2)

## Section Ten

### 10. Lane Assignments

- 10.1.** Lane assignments in Dual Plus meets are determined by a team’s listing in the calendar / schedule posted on the AAAA Web Site.
- 10.1.1** For Dual Meets at **AH, BL, NE, and NS:** the team listed first in the League posted schedule ([www.aaaa-sa.org](http://www.aaaa-sa.org)) will swim in odd numbered lanes and the opposition, listed second, will swim in the even numbered lanes.
- 10.1.1.1** There may be a second heat if necessary.
- 10.1.1.2** All six, or eight, lanes must be utilized.
- 10.1.1.3** Events will be seeded fastest to slowest unless any relevant meet information states otherwise.
- 10.2** For Triangular and Double Dual meets at **BL, NE, and NS:** the team listed first in the posted schedule ([www.aaaa-sa.org](http://www.aaaa-sa.org)) will swim in lanes two and five, the team listed second will swim in lanes three and six, and the team listed third will swim in lanes four and seven.
- 10.2.1** In a six-lane pool, lanes change to one and four / two and five / three and six
- 10.2.2** There may be two (2) heats if necessary.
- 10.2.3** All six or eight, lanes must be utilized.
- 10.2.4** Events will be seeded **fastest to slowest** unless any relevant meet information states otherwise.

## Section Eleven

### 11. Other League Meets (NOT-Dual Plus)

11.1. During each High School Swimming and Diving Season the League often conducts one or more “other kinds” of meets.

11.1.2 Not all are held every year and each will usually have specific, detailed Meet Informations associated with them and posted on the AAAA Web Site

### 11.3 Fall and Winter Invitationals (Named Invitationals)

11.3.1 In order to control the size of these meets, the AAAA Executive Board will implement procedures to determine which teams will compete at each venue prior to the start of the high school season.

11.3.2 Swimmers may NOT swim any event in which they have achieved a life-time best time faster than the slower than times specified in the meet information.

11.3.3 Entries into all meets will be in accordance with UIL and National Federation Rules; i.e. a competitor shall be permitted to enter a maximum of four (4) events, no more than two (2) of which may be individual events (Rule 3, Section 2, Article 1).

11.3.4. Relay entries are restricted to two (2) relays, A and B, per team.

### 11.4 South Zone TISCA Swimming and Diving Championships

11.4.1 Traditional San Antonio Meet held in the late fall of each year and open to all TISCA Member High Schools.

11.4.2 Detailed Meet Information is posted on the AAAA Web Site near the start of school each year, which includes specifications for the diving competition.

11.4.3 This meet is normally held over three days in a preliminary / final championship format with modified FINA World Cup Swimming Event Order.

11.4.4 **IMPORTANT NOTE:** Section Six.6.3.2 DOES NOT APPLY to this meet

### 11.5 Pentathlons

11.5.1 Time Trial-like Meets held at the beginning of the high school season

11.5.2 Individual swimmers may enter a maximum of five (5) events – no relays

## Section Twelve

### 12. HY-TEK Meet and Team Manager

12.1. Team and Meet Management software has been available for a number of years and continues to improve as technology and hardware evolve. HY-TEK software is universally utilized in the League.

12.1.1 In order for **Team Manager** to be mutually useful and beneficial to Teams and Meet Hosts alike, there are several matters requiring standardization. Please comply with the following requirements when setting up your Team’s database in Team Manager.

12.1.1.1 Schools MUST use their actual Team / School Name (John Marshall High School, Episcopal School of Texas, etc.) as assigned by the UIL or the League

12.1.1.2 Team mascot names, e.g. “Mavs”, “Warriors”, etc. and LSC names MUST NOT be used in any Entry Field in Team Manager. ***Please also see Appendix D.***

12.1.2 Please ensure the following items are properly entered or left blank as noted:

12.1.2.1 Team Name - Your school’s actual and complete name (no mascot names please!)

12.1.2.2 Team short name - The name your Team normally uses, e.g. “Clark or Reagan”

12.1.2.3 Type of Registration – Leave Blank or select “Other”.

12.1.2.4 Type of Team – Leave Blank.

12.1.2.5 Under Mailing Information please ensure the “LSC” field is left BLANK.





- 12.1.3** The swimmers *numerical* grade level must be included for all entries, e.g., 09, 10, 11, and 12
- 12.1.4** If coaches expect times achieved by high school athletes currently registered with USA Swimming and competing in eligible meets to be uploaded into the SWIMS National Database, data for such athletes must be complete and accurate in every respect.

## Section Thirteen

### 13. Meet Results, Scores, and Commlink Files

- 13.1.** Swimmers, coaches and parents are often anxious to know the results of swimming and Diving competitions. To that end Meet Hosts are strongly encouraged to make the necessary data files available for posting on the AAAA Web Site and perhaps in local newspapers as well.
- 13.1.1** As soon as possible after the conclusion of each AAHSSL meet at each of the six (6) venues, the Meet Director is required to submit a SwmmBkup File from the meet or each meet as the case may be, to the AAAA Webmaster at: [swimsa@att.net](mailto:swimsa@att.net).
- 13.1.2** There is only one file required from each meet, which is generated from the Meet Manager Main Menu.
- 13.1.2.1** Click on File, then Backup and follow the prompts.
- 13.1.2.2** The file produced will be named by default: "SwmmBkup...0#" where # may be any digit from one to nine.
- 13.1.2.3** The SwmmBkup File is Zipped by default. Please do not attempt to Zip it again.
- 13.1.2.4** Attach the SwmmBkup File to an email message and send it to: [swimsa@att.net](mailto:swimsa@att.net)
- 13.2** Each of the meet venues is also responsible for e-mailing Results and Scores from each and every meet to the San Antonio Express News Sports Department.
- 13.2.1** The necessary files are generated from the Reports Menu.
- 13.2.2** Results are normally prepared in the AP News Standard Format with commas and semi-colons.
- 13.2.3** Scores should be submitted as Microsoft Word or Text Documents – the latter is usually preferable.
- 13.2.4** Attach both files to an e-mail message and send to: [sports@express-news.net](mailto:sports@express-news.net).
- 13.2.5** Depending on the reporter assigned, additional copies may need to be sent to still another e-mail address specified by the reporter.



## APPENDIX A

### Fly-over Starts

1. Fly-over Starts are utilized ONLY for individual events, when it is safe and expedient to do so.
2. Fly-over Starts are not utilized for relays or for backstroke events.
3. Fly-over Starts may or may not be utilized for the 500-yard freestyle at the discretion of the Meet Referee who will provide any necessary information at the coaches' meeting prior to the start of a meet.
4. The purpose of fly-over starts is to conserve time and to establish and maintain meet momentum.

### The Procedure:

1. When the last swimmer in a race is finishing and approximately five yards from the wall; the Deck Referee will sound the short whistles, which alerts the next heat to be immediately be prepared to mount the blocks.
2. When the last swimmer in the incoming heat is within approximately one yard or less of touching the wall, the Deck Referee will sound the long whistle and all swimmers MUST IMMEDIATELY mount the blocks and prepare for a start.
3. As soon as the Deck Referee is satisfied the course is clear and all is in readiness, her / his arm will be extended and the Starter will give the "Take your mark" Command.

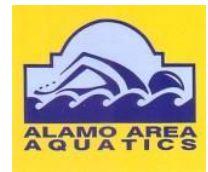
## APPENDIX B

### UIL Approved Relay Take-off Judging Protocol

The current **National Federation of High Schools Swimming and Diving Rule Book** will be utilized for reference on rule changes and State allowed modifications. All UIL member schools are required to abide by these adoptions.

**Article I:** In any UIL competition, when resources permit, at least one (1) relay takeoff judge should be assigned to observe the relay exchanges. In championship meets, two (2) relay takeoff judges must be assigned this responsibility.

**Article II:** In any UIL competition, when electronic relay takeoff (RTO) equipment is utilized in addition to two (2) relay takeoff judges, the determination of an early relay takeoff is as follows: It shall be a rule violation when any combination of two (2) of the three (3) components agree on an infraction with at least one (1) relay takeoff judge and the electronic equipment or both judges.



## APPENDIX C

### AAHSSL Team Identification Codes

Four-letter codes are assigned to Public High Schools by the UIL and are mandated for use state-wide. They are current as of 07/20/16

Three-letter Private / Parochial School codes are assigned locally and are normally valid for only local use. The three-letter codes posted on the AAAA Web Site **are mandatory** for use in the AAHSSL and are not subject to change. Entries received by Meet Hosts utilizing alternative codes will most probably be rejected.
